





# Introduction | Why This Matters



#### The Urgency of Change

What have we 'forgotten,' and what can we reimagine through circular thinking and design? Imagine a world without waste. Imagine resources that regenerate, where technologies can be well maintained, repaired, upgraded, and a system where everything comes full circle.

There are enough innovative ways to use resources for thriving communities globally - resources are finite. By making different choices and redefining what a successful society looks like, we can solve problems that never existed in the past and prevent those we don't want in the future. A circular approach benefits all life and the planet.

#### South Africa Circular Economy Hotspot 2024 (SACEH24)

In **2024**, we hosted the first Circular Economy Hotspot Event in Cape Town. The conference featured a diverse array of speakers and exhibitors, highlighting key topics and sectors that **urgently need transformation**.

From resource scarcity and environmental degradation to pollution and social inequality, we explored **solutions** to shift from negative to positive impacts. Like many countries worldwide, South Africa faces a critical need to transition towards **sustainable business** and **industry practices**. The conference served as a platform to introduce, share, and exchange knowledge on the Circular Economy.

# South Africa Circular Summit 2025 (SACES25)





**1. Closing the Loop: Regenerative Agri-Food Systems:** the journey of food and agricultural resources through the entire value chain — from farm to table, and back to the soil. By bringing together farmers, food scientists, retailers, waste innovators, and community enablers, we explore how regenerative and circular solutions can transform food systems into engines of resilience and sustainability.
